Education Pack

This free download education pack is aimed at Key Stage 2 children (P3-P7 in Scotland). With this pack you will be able to encourage children to take an interest in their local freshwater environment and to learn about some of the wildlife, particularly invertebrates, living there. It also raises their awareness of how humans can have an effect on other animals and plants they live with.

The pack introduces the idea that the occurrence of certain species of invertebrates in a body of freshwater is indicative of the health of the water (how polluted it is). It also challenges the children to consider how important invertebrates are in a freshwater ecosystem.
